Electricity


<u>EIA</u> predicts electricity consumption in the U.S. to increase by 2.3% in the residential sector and 0.7% in the commercial sector in 2021 after falling nearly 4% in 2020. One of the factors driving consumption has been the cold weather we've experienced so far in 2021 and economic growth as we come out of the pandemic. Looking ahead to 2022, EIA forecasts electricity consumption to grow by 1.3% overall.

Natural Gas Pricing

Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$5.35 per MMBtu in February, an increase from \$2.71 per MMBtu in January. This is the highest monthly Henry Hub spot price since February 2014. Again, the sharp rise in prices is largely due to the colder than expected temperatures across the country as well as the drop in natural gas production associated with the freeze-offs in Texas.

Natural gas prices averaged \$2.62 per MMBtu in March. Pricing came down precipitously from the February average. This is mostly due to better weather around the country that contributed to a sharp drop in demand for heating. EIA expects gas prices will average \$3.04 per MMBtu for all of 2021, up from \$2.03 per MMBtu last vear.

Natural Gas Storage Levels

The EIA says inventory withdrawals in February were 829 Bcf. That's the largest February withdrawal on record. February included a record weekly withdrawal of 156 Bcf, mostly because of the conditions in Texas. Due to cold weather through February, natural gas inventories ended March about 2% lower than the five-year average. However, EIA is predicting inventories will end the 2021 injection season at more than 3.7 Tcf, right in line with the five-year average.

Renewable Energy

Electricity generation from renewable energy sources is expected to grow to 21% in 2021, up from 20% in 2020. For 2022 the EIA expects that number to jump to 23%. EIA is forecasting 16.1 gigawatts of new wind capacity will be added in 2021 and 5.8 gigawatts in 2022. EIA expects U.S. solar capacity to rise by 15.8 GW in 2021 and 14.9 GW in 2022.

Carbon Dioxide (CO²) Emissions

U.S. energy-related carbon dioxide emissions decreased by 11% in 2020. The decline in emissions results from the economic implications of the COVID-19 pandemic. EIA predicts CO² emissions will increase by 6% in 2021 when energy consumption increases as the economy continues to recover.
